THE BIBLE

The Bible is *the only* spiritual book of final authority for the serious Christian.

The Bible reveals if heaven and hell are real places. If alcoholism is a *disease* or a sinful, moral weakness. Why God loves homosexuals and fornicators and yet, hates their sin. Why all Christians are in recovery. Why a religious, self-righteous, do-gooder, of all sinners is the most deceived.

The Bible answers the critical questions of life. It has stood the test of time. It is the number one, all time best seller. It is a gift from God to all who are searching for the TRUTH.

The Bible should be opened with prayer. Prayer conveys to God humility, faith and a teachable attitude.

The Bible is supernatural. To understand it the Holy Spirit must be involved in our reading or study.

1 John 5:9- We believe men who witness in our courts, and so surely we can believe whatever God declares. And God declares that Jesus is His Son. All who believe this know in their hearts that it is true. Was a warming feeling to read about addicts, helping addicts so to recover their lost souls from that vortex of madness and spiritual bankruptcy. I'm serving time in Monroe on a 3rd strike. I use to have a \$1,000.00 a day crack habit. **Scott**

I was playing cards three days ago when a Brother passed me the book "Back-slider". After reading the first page I couldn't put it down till I read half the book. You see I'm a born again Christian who has backslid. Like any other backslider I did drugs and alcohol. A voice in my head told me not to take some drugs which I'm sure was the Holy Spirit. But I ended up listening to my flesh. As a result I'm now locked up. I would like to receive your newsletter. **Ignacio**

I want to stay clean and sober and put my focus on Jesus. **Donna**

I am a backslider and a Christian in recovery. Over the last year not only have I relapsed but I also had a sexual relationship with a woman without marrying her. I also relapsed on Crack after 7 years of recovery. I used to attend weekly CIR meetings and many people warned me that what I was doing was biblically wrong. I did not listen to them. Now I'm back in jail waiting to be sentenced. I've repented and have asked God to forgive me. I want to ask all the brothers and sisters at CIR to forgive me too. What I was doing was wrong! I was reading your newsletter and I want you to know I loved it. The articles and letters were wonderful. I'm a 37 year old male who is so very tired of doingdrugs & etc... I've done about 12 years of my life in prison. I want to learn more about Christians In Recovery. I have a good friend named Mark Zabik whohas changed his life over to God, and is very happy. But for me I'm a backslider who needs help badly. Right now I'm in RJC waiting to go to drug court. I need to find some sober people to hang out with. If you have any help for an old drug addict like myself, I would really appreciate it. Randy

I'm in prison serving a long sentence for child molestation in the first degree. I plead guilty. My victims were two sisters. They considered me to be their faither, they trusted me. Their mother and I were crack heads. We squandered a very large inheritance on crack as we watched porno day after day. Eventually to satisfy my selfish, perverted desires I began to touch and fondle my girlfriends 2 girls. I did this on six or seven different occasions. Eventually I got them to touch me also. My sin found me out when they told their grandmother. The police came and I confessed. The girls were taken from their mother and I was sent to prison. I realize the life long scars I have caused. I am truly sorry. I have found forgiveness through Jesus Christ. Very grateful for your ministry. A brother in Christ.

Dear Anthony, (Anthony, is a CIR volunteer letter writer, and Deacon) I haven't got a letter in a long time. Your letter was great! Sue! Mike's wife wrote me a few months ago and that was the only one I have got in about a year. I'm starting to get back on track with Jesus. As for my release? I will never be getting out of prison. I will keep Jesus by me always. When I wake He is on my mind. When go to bed each night He is on my mind. Someday He will come and get me. When I go to the Chapel service I feel my faith growing. I am not a *drugy*, but I am a sinner. I have a loving wife and a English bull dog. I own a nice house on 2 acres. I have put my wife, and home at risk. My wife warned me but I didn't listen. Dear Sue, I'm 42 years and never been in in trouble with the law. Now I find myself here in Kootenai County Jail waiting for sentencing for, forgery, petty theft and possession of meth. "I'm scared to death what will happen to me." I've been using drugs & manipulating people since I was 13. I want to change! A friend in jail turned me on to you & your husbands newsletter. (I'm not much of a reader) but, I couldn't put it down. I've always believed in God but, when I lost my husband in '85, I lost hope. I was angry with God for taking the only man that ever treated me with respect and love. At home I have 5 Bibles sitting in my closet. I never found time to sit quickly by myself & start reading. I never thought I was a good enough person to have God in my life. I now realize that all this has happened so that I could become closer to the Lord Jesus Christ! What The Bible Says About

"Prosperity Preachers"

The infamous *JIM BAKKER* used to be a prosperity preacher. After serving 5 years in prison he changed his doctrine, (after God humbled him). He confessed and repented of his prosperity heresy and greed.

Before Brother Bakker was brought down I was a client in his recovery house called "Fort Hope".

I and the other men in recovery used to watch these extravagant prosperity preachers being chauffeured in black limonsines around the hundreds of acres of the Jim & Tammy Bakkers kingdom. These preachers were famous TV pastors and evangelists. They thought of themselves as superstars. They expected to be treated like royalty and they were.

In those days Jim's prosperity ministry was taking in over 4 million a week through the mail. Jim received his cut of 1.9 million that year.

The humble pastor and his wife that headed up Bakker's recovery ministry that I was part of was paid \$1,200. per month and they had kids. But, they weren't famous, dramatic, charismatic celebrities. They were just faithful humble servants.

Greed was the reason Tammy divorced Jim after he was sent to prison. She remarried another rich guy. It's hard to live humble (moderation) after you've been accustomed to living large.

The love of money is the root of evil that causes most divorces.

Love for money prevents gifted, God called, Christians from surrendering to the full-time ministry.

I appreciate the testimony of *David Wilkerson*. He is a well known evangelist and pastor, sold millions of books and for years has driven a reasonably priced Honda.

Christian leaders are tempted to bow to the temptation of greed. Jesus resisted and set the example. Ezekiel 33:31 So they come as though they are sincere and sit before you listening. But they have no intention of doing what I tell them to; they talk sweetly about loving the Lord, but with their hearts they are loving their money.

Ezekiel 34:2- Woe to the shepherds who feed themselves instead of their flocks. Shouldn't shepherds feed the sheep? You eat the best food and wear the finest clothes, but you let your flocks starve...I will save my flock from being taken for their food! ...and I will destroy the powerful, fat shepherds.

Matt. 6:24 No one can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or else he will be loyal to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money.

Titus 1:7 For the bishop as an overseer and God's steward must be blameless; not self-willed or arrogant or presumptuous; he must not be quick-tempered or given to drink or pugnacious (brawling, violent); he must not be grasping and **greedy for filthy lucre** (financial gain).

1 Tim. 3:2- A bishop(church leader)...not a lover of money—insatiable for wealth and ready to **obtain it by questionable means.**

2 Tim. 3:1- ...in the last days...people will be **lovers of self** and [utterly] self-centered, **lovers of money** and aroused by an inordinate (greedy) desire for wealth, **proud and arrogant...**

2 Tim. 3:3 For there is going to come a time when people won't listen to the truth but will go around looking for teachers who will tell them just what they want to hear. They won't listen to what the Bible says but will blithely follow their own misguided ideas.

Jude 1:11 **Woe upon them!** For they will follow the example of Cain who killed his brother; and like Balaam, **they will do anything for money**;

Prosperity preachers manipulate the church to sacrificially give, so that they can extravagantly live.

Rev. 3:15 I know your [record of] works...I will spew you out of my mouth! For YOU SAY, I am rich, I have **prospered and grown wealthy**, and I am in need of nothing: and...you are wretched, pitiable, poor, blind, naked.

Jeremiah 6:13 They are swindlers and liars, from the least of them right to the top! Yes, even my prophets and priests!

1 Tim. 6:5 ...men who are corrupted in mind and bereft of the truth, who imagine that godliness or righteousness is a source of profit—a money making business, a means of livelihood. From such withdraw.

Titus 1:11 And it must be stopped. Already whole families have been turned away from the grace of God. Such teachers are only after your money.

1 Tim. 4:1, 2 But the Holy Spirit tells us clearly that in the last times some in the church will turn away from Christ and become eager followers of teachers with devil-inspired ideas. These teachers will **tell lies with straight faces** and do it so often that their consciences won't even bother them.

Paul came to a *CIR* meeting as an alcoholic in recovery. He's had (3) DUI's. He testified with joy that he had 6 years of sobriety. But, he failed to mention that he had a habit of looking at Internet porn and that he was sexually active with a Christian Sister that he was not married to.

Paul came to another meeting and the Holy Spirit jumped all over him. He confessed his fornication and porn issue. He asked for prayer and repented. He sought accountability and fellowship. That was about 18 months ago.

Sweet SUEPREMO, and I are getting away for the weekend to celebrate our 25th wedding anniversary.





Jail Ministry

In jail, the stage has been set by God. He has prepared the hearts of His people. He has brought them to a place of brokenness. A place where they can hear God speak. He is drawing them by His Spirit and then walks in a faithful jail minister.

What does the jail minister bring to these hungry broken souls? We must bring them the GOOD NEWS! God loves them and Jesus saves!We must bring them hope and understanding.

Remember back to the moment that you were saved. How did God get your attention? Did God prepare your heart to receive His message?

There are at least four types of people in jail. Those who are Christians and need encouragement. Those who are not Christians but are open to God. Those who have hard hearts and not open to God's love. Those who are mature disciples of Christ and are ready and willing to minister to the jail minister.

The mature jail minister goes behind the wall wanting only God's will to be done. It's all about God's agenda. The Holy Spirit must lead the program!

Things to consider.

Think of others better than yourself. *Phil. 2:3* Do nothing out of selfish ambition or vain conceit, but in humility consider others better than yourselves.

Be humble.

Gal. 6:3 If anyone thinks he is something when he is nothing he deceives himself.

Be sincere. *1 Tim. 1:5* The goal of this command is love, which comes from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.

Do not be afraid of looking foolish. You don't have to be perfect. If you are sincere and humble God will honor your efforts.

Stay out of God's way. Zech. 4:6 So he said to me, "This is the word of the LORD to Zerubbabel: 'Not by might nor by power, but by My Spirit,' says the Lord Almighty.

If you come with your own agenda you may miss out on what God wanted to do, or worse yet, get in His way.

Be sensitive to the need of the moment. *Eph. 4:29* ...but only such a word as is good for edification according to the need of the moment, so that it will give grace to those who hear.

Without shame pray and praise God. *Acts 16:25* About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening to them.

Keep it simple. 1 Cor. 2:1- When I came to you, brothers, I did not come with eloquence or superior wisdom as I proclaimed to you the testimony about God. For I resolved to know nothing while I was with you except Jesus Christ and him crucified. I came to you in weakness and fear, and with much trembling. My message and my preaching were not with wise and persuasisve words, but with a demonstration of the Spirit's power, so that your faith might not rest on men's wisdom but on God's power.

Be faithful. *Rev.* 19:11 I saw heaven standing open and there before me was a white horse, whose rider is called Faithful and True...

I was introduced to the jail ministry by Mike Premo and he instilled in me the importance of being faithful. He said "Give me a faithful man over a gifted man any day."

Stay away from foolish arguments. *Titus 3:9* But avoid foolish controversies ...because they are unprofitable and useless.

Be like Jesus and relate. *Heb.* 13:3 Remember those in prison as if you were their fellow prisoners,...

Do not be ashamed for the inmates but put yourself in their shoes and sympathize with them. If you or I were caught for all our crimes throughout our life would not we also be locked up? *But for the grace* of *God there go I!*

Do we think we are better? If we do, then we are deceived and not able to effectively relate to other sinners.

Who is qualified to be a jail minister? *Is.* 6:8 Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us? And I said, "Here am I. Send me!

1 Cor. 1:27 But God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chose the weak things of the world to shame the strong.

A little over three years ago I rededicated my life back to God. I repented of my self indulgent lifestyle and asked God to make me a true disciple of Jesus. I committed to be a faithful jail minister.

I'm doing the work of the ministry. I have been given the opportunity to participate and not just sit in a pew and observe. I like the action.

Serving God is now my purpose for living.

When I get out in Six months I will be given back my bible that I won from the CIR ministry. I pray for the victims of my crimes (I did property crimes). I am a backsliddin Christian. I am currently in the Seatac Federal Prison because of my sin. As a result of my sin I have lost my marriage of 15 years. Thank you sooo much for such inspiring & uplifting fellowship. I got all this and more from (1) CIR newsletter. I've been "down" 8 years for a drug charge. I will be getting out soon. I prayed and asked the Lord to send me to a church that He wants me to be part of. I'm asking if I can be released to your ministry. I promise to participate and abide by all the rules and duties. I desire to contribute something back. I hope and look forward to fellowship with you, till then please join me in prayer: Bring my soul out of prison; the righteous shall surround me, for the Lord shall deal bountifully with me. I went to prison chapel this morning and got a word. Do not be misled, bad company corrupts good character. These types of people should be avoided, lazy & slothful who have no vision and the angry and immoral. The kind of people God wants us to hang around will motivate and encourage us in the will of God. We should hang out with people who are sympathetic, kind, humble, gentle and patient. Sympathy meets two fundamental human needs 1) the need to be understood. 2) the need to have your feelings validated. Sympathetic Christians will build friendship and fellowship. Real Christian fellowship is a place where mistakes are not rubbed in, but rubbed out. Where mercy wins over justice. Gary

Secrets & Lies—everyone has pain. So be kind. Everyone you meet is fighting a battle! I was a gang member in the street and then I became a Texas prison gang member. Now I am a true sold out gang member for Jesus Christ. When I read your *CIR newsletter* compassion came on me toward all those lost sheep your trying to reach. Thank you for touching the outcast of this world with the message of our Lord Jesus Christ. Please send more newsletters. I love you guys. **Reynadozo**

The Chaplain let me pass out your newsletter to all the girls in our city jail. I told them to pass them on after their done reading. I tell the girls in jail that Jesus identifies with them more than with a lot of free world people who think they have it all together. His heart is for those who know they are imperfect Please send more newsletters. **Aunt Connie**

Dear *CIR*, thank you for sending your newsletters. I'm a 37 year old dope fiend from hell. I want to stop backsliding. I've done over 14 years in prison. Currently I'm in *RJC* waiting for drug court. I read *CIR* newsletters over and over every week. They make me feel that I have really accepted my Savior into my heart. **Randy**

I want to congradulate CIR for your ministry acomplishments. I have been a severe backslider. I read "Backslider" about a year ago and was moved by that book. My relationship is strong with God now. I don't ever want to backslide again. I want to do God's will, not mine. Before I ended up here in prison I was building my little empire. I owned 30 houses and had a job that paid me over 100,000. per year. My wife and children went to church with me each Sunday. My kids went to a private school. Then one day I ran into an old friend who gave me a bag of speed. I was so solid in my life situation that I thought I could handle it. That first bad decision led to many more. In three years I lost my family, my houses, became broke and homeless and now find myself in prison serving 29 months for writing bad checks.
